

Getting Started with ENPS Mobile

The ENPS Mobile Suite lets users access ENPS through the Web and mobile devices. This guide will give you a quick overview of the ENPS Mobile.

Smartphone Client

If you have an iPad, iPhone or Android device you can connect to ENPS using the Mobile Smartphone Client.


- Read the latest wires.
- Write stories.
- Search wires, folder contents or contacts.
- Send messages to other ENPS users.



Web Client

The Web Client lets journalists on the road perform many of the same functions that are available on the regular desktop client. The interface closely matches the look and feel of the regular desktop client include Top Line Messages and a system clock.

- Can be used from any workstation or laptop (PC or Mac) with an Internet connection. The computer must be running either Internet Explorer or Firefox. Devices running Chrome, Rock Melt or Safari will automatically run the ENPS Smartphone client.
- Read the latest wires.
- Write and edit stories.
- Write and edit items in Rundowns and Newsgathering Grids.
- Manage contacts.
- Send and receive Top Line Messages.
- Perform Searches for ENPS stories, wires and contacts.



WAP Client


Allows users to view stories, Rundowns, and Newsgathering grids from both personal and group folders. You can connect to ENPS using a mobile phone that allows you to open Web pages such as a BlackBerry. If your phone is not able to connect to the Smartphone client, you will be connected to the WAP Client.

- Read the latest wires.
- Write stories outside an ENPS rundown.
- Search wires and folder contents.
- Send messages to other ENPS users.



Tablet Story Viewer

The Tablet Story Viewer allows anchors and reporters to view the latest version of a story on an Apple iPad or qualified Android Tablet, eliminating the need for printed copies of stories. The Tablet Story Viewer connects to ENPS through a wireless connection or mobile broadband connection.



- Touch ^ on the Smartphone Client to bring up TSV.
- Hold tablet in landscape view to view rundown and story or portrait view to view story alone.
- Skip floated/dropped stories.
- The Tablet Story Viewer must be refreshed for any stories added.
- The Tablet Story Viewer is read-only.
- The Rundown pane and story viewer panes can be scrolled separately.
- For best results on an iPad bookmark the address for The Tablet Story Viewer inside the Web browser. Do not place a shortcut on the home screen. Bookmarking inside the browser allows you to open multiple tabs for the Tablet Story Viewer making it easier and faster to move quickly between newscasts.

Microsoft Outlook Add-in

The ENPS Outlook add-in lets users view ENPS data alongside their e-mail.

- Read the latest wires.
- View Rundowns and Newsgathering Grids.
- Read stories.
- Manage contacts.
- Send and receive messages from ENPS users.
- Search wires and folder contents.
